

Matching Campaign for Back to School!

Another matching campaign is underway! We have an anonymous donor who's agreed to match the first \$5,000 we receive for our emergency weekend food bags from now until Friday, September 15, 2023. Our donor wants to make sure that no child in Monroe goes hungry, and so do we!

When we learned back in 2011 that many of Monroe's school children were going hungry over the weekend, we started giving backpacks with 2 breakfasts, lunches, dinners, and 6 snacks to any child who might otherwise be going without. Over the years our program has grown to an average 270 bags per week, serving 7 schools. When you do the math, we're buying 21,600 cartons of milk, entrees, fruit, and oatmeal to get through the school year, not to mention the 64,800 snacks! That's 151,200 items we have to purchase! Our food bags will cost an average \$6.50 each, making the program run about \$70,000 per year. Luckily, you and our anonymous donor are here to help us get started on that!

We can't tell you enough how much this garden means to us by allowing us to provide such healthy food options to our community. Our customers are always delighted to know that some of the produce provided to them is grown here on site.
